Announcements on the Intercom

Mediation doesn't happen unless the disputants know they have access to it. Announcements over the intercom are an easy way to inform the student body about TAP. Here is an example script. Feel free to make your own and have fun with it!

Student 1: Have you heard of TAP?

Student 2: What do you mean? Tap dancing, tapping out during wrestling, tapping a pencil when you're thinking, a tap on the shoulder?

Student 1: Nooooo. TAP stands for Talk About the Problems. It's when two peer mediators come together to help two students resolve conflict peacefully. To learn more about TAP, talk to a TAP mediator or a counselor.
